After changing a couple co-drivers, It was “Neil” who decided that he would remain as Richie’s co-driver. They have been a Team since 1996 and are always top contenders.

## JRDC Independence Race Meet

If motor racing, beautiful women and high octane excitement is what gets you going, then get to the track early, as a few thousand others like yourself will be present to witness some long anticipated and enduring showdowns of man and machine on the Caribbean's most challenging racing circuit.

If you are able to pay some attention to things other than food and fun, look at the track as the battle between "Bull" Thompson's turbo-charged Mazda RX7, a car that has held the lap record at Dover in naturally aspirated form and the radically improved Mitsubishi Lancer Evolutions of Team Mobay Racing's Douglas (Evo 8) and Matthew (Evo 7) Gore, Guy Fraser (who dominated the June meet winning 4 of 5 races entered and finishing second in the other in his Evo 6), Gary "Shorty" Williams, faster now than ever before (Evo 2), as well as the red Evolution 6 1/2 of "King" David Summerbell Jr. with a brand new engine built by Stephen Gunter, along with new 17" tires take center stage.

Tarik Minott who campaigns the Miphone Toyota Starlet is expecting great results at the meet. Team Xpress Racing's Rohan Clarke (defending IP39 champion) should be joined by local Trelawny and St. Ann residents Duane Rowe and Eric Edwards, both with Toyota power, to challenge female champion Lisa Bowman-Lee, Peter Jaggon and Teyron Ramdon.

The entry level IP45 class will be overseen by Andrew Jackson this time around.

The action is brought to you by Cable & Wireless Online High Speed, Pimpjuice, Exmil Security Services Ltd., Tyre Warehouse, Guardian Fencing and Power 106, and starts at 8.30 am with open practice, with the first race set to make its rolling start at 12.10pm. A total of 8 races will be run on the day

**FAST FACTS:**

ASN means National Sporting Authority.

In the mid 60's, the "Auto Owners Club" which was formed in 1957, merged with the "forces Motoring Club", an organization originally from the British Military, stationed overseas. This club was closely linked with the British based Royal Automobile Club (RAC), who in turn were affiliated with the Federation International de L'Automobile (FIA), the world's Governing Body for Motorsports.

The JMC was so renamed in 1970 as the local representative of the World Governing Body (FIA), governing all auto sports clubs in Jamaica.

The JMC quickly moved to obtain recognition by the FIA, which enabled them to host several International Rallies, attracting World Rally Championship (WRC) class drivers and machinery, with some events boasting as many as seventy entrants. The name of the Club has since been changed to the Jamaica Millenium Motoring Club effective March 2003.
